

**Brackley Morris Men**, Brackley, Northamptonshire (UK)

*Year founded:* 1959 *Gender:* men *Organization(s):* Morris Ring, Northamptonshire Folk Activities Association *Dance type(s):* Cotswold morris, mumming *Tradition(s) / style(s):* Brackley, Hinton-in-the-Hedges, Adderbury, Badby, Bampton, Bucknell, Bledington, Fieldtown, Headington, Litchfield, Sherborne. *Kit/Livery:* White shirt and trousers; Black shoes. Baldricks over both shoulders with two rosettes (with ribbons) on each - at front and back; one on each shoulder (10 rosettes); ribbons at ends of each baldrick. Cumberbund. Dancers choose their own colours for all items of kit except hat decorations. Black top-hat/topper with red (top), white, black, blue ribbon (respectively) around the hat with a rosette each - side: blue, white, red. Bell pads: plain leather 20 bells on each pad (5×4)
